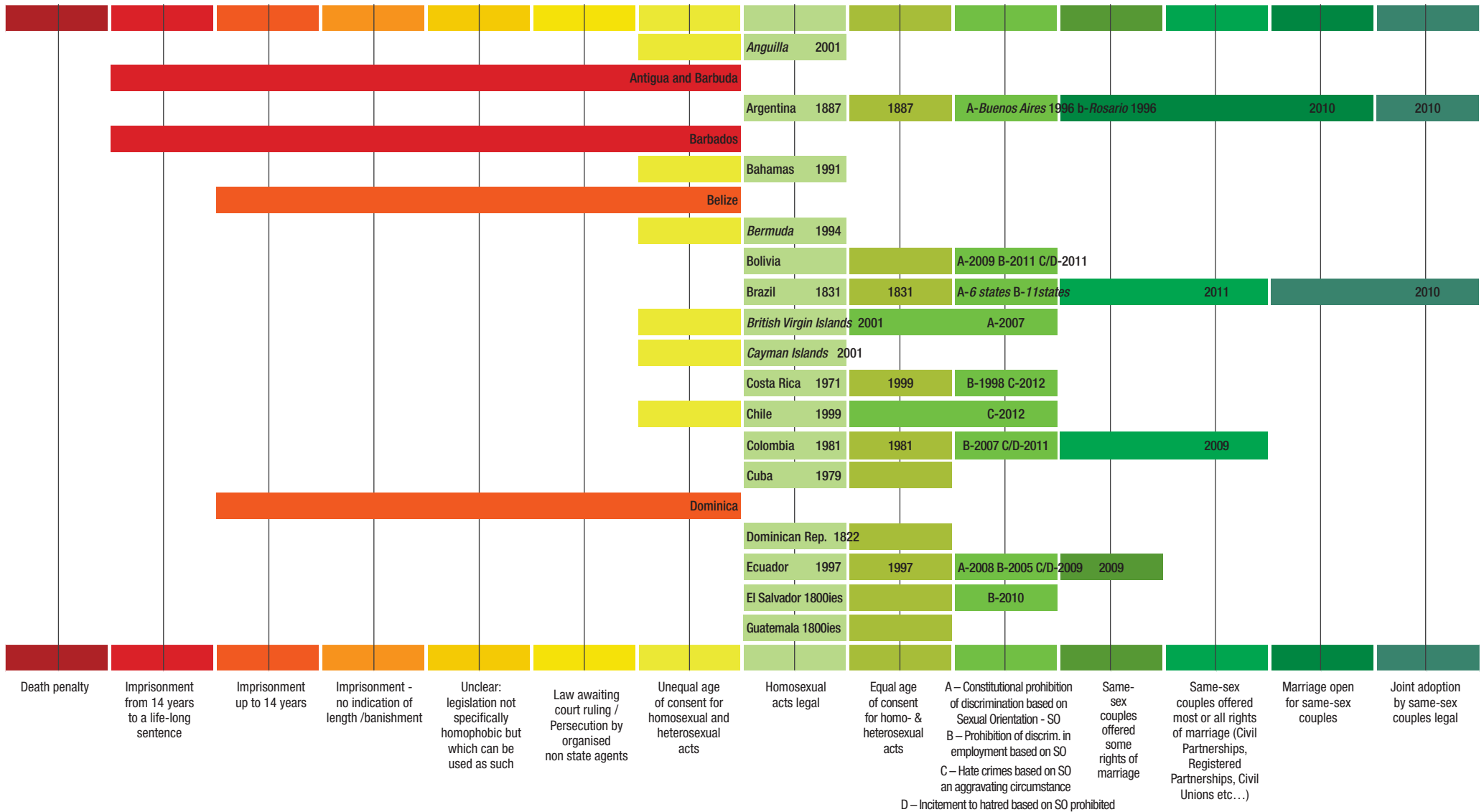

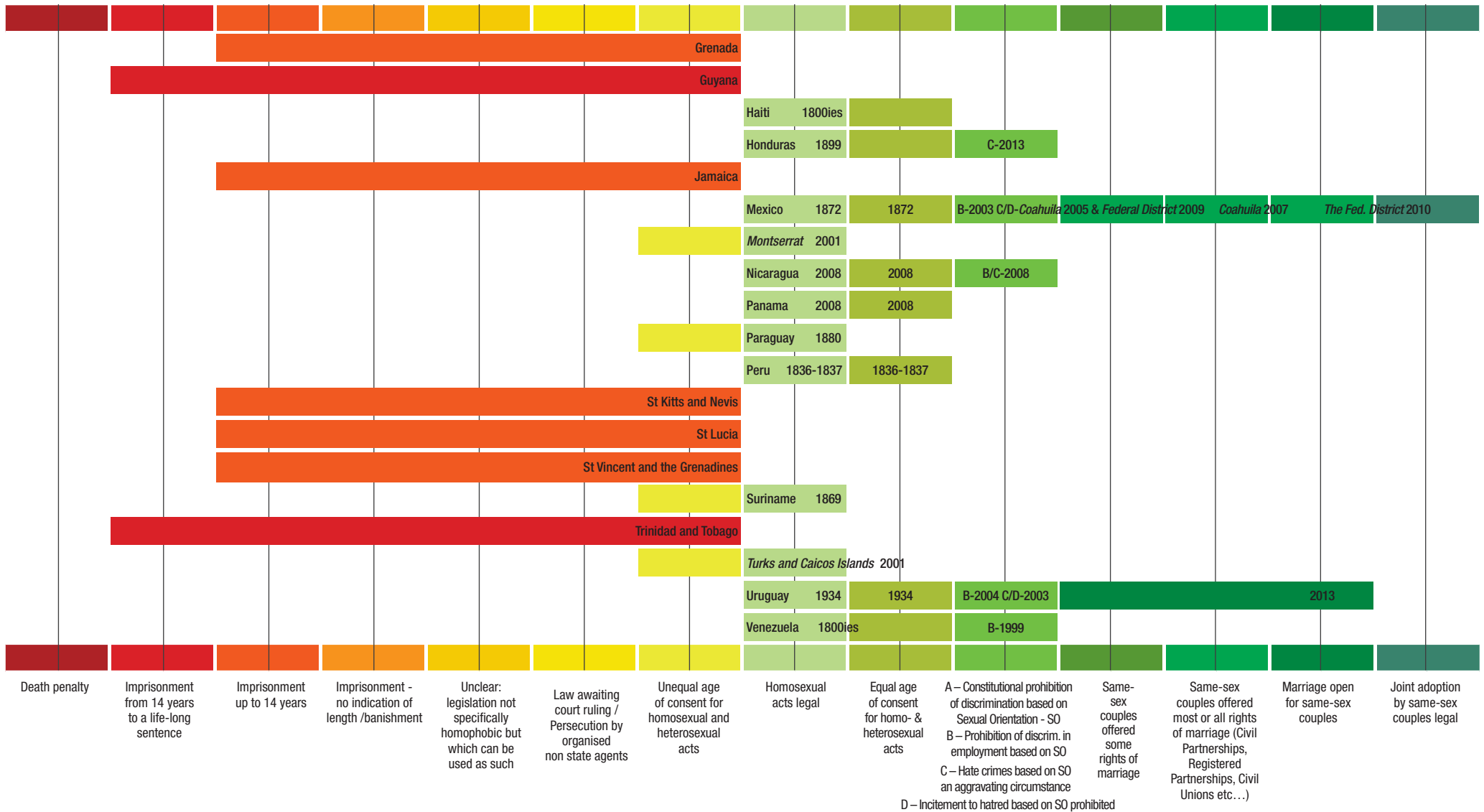

Protection
Anti-discrimination laws: 9 countries and 28 entities

Recognition of same-sex unions: 5 countries and 2 entities
Joint adoption: Argentina, Brazil and Federal District of Mexico

These laws are aimed at lesbians, gay men and bisexuals and at same-sex activities and relationships. At times, they also apply to trans and intersex people.
